DRAFT RULES OF ENGAGEMENT FOR OPERATION PARAQUET

Note by the Secretaries

- 1. This note covers three sets of instructions which need to be agreed for issue to ships involved in Operation Paraquet. These cover:
 - a) Transit towards South Georgia on the high seas outside any declared Zone;
 - b) Transit within the declared Argentinian "Defence Zone" of 200 nautical miles around South Georgia;
 - c) Execution of Operation Paraquet within this Zone.
- 2. The Rules of Engagement to cover these three phases involve the following:
 - a) Transit towards South Georgia (Annex A)

 Overriding aim is to avoid provocation but respond to aggression with firmness.

i) Surface Vessels

Minimum force to be used in response to any clear intent to engage. All units may assist in defence of any unit which is attacked. Maritime International Law is not to be broken unless necessary in order to achieve aim.



ii) SSNs

Surveillance to be covert, evading if detected. Engagement of enemy only if attacked first.

b) Transit within Argentinian "Defence Zone" (Annex B)

Aim is to show sufficient force to dissuade Argentinian units from enforcing their "Defence Zone".

i) Surface Vessels

To achieve transit, take any necessary action against positively identified Argentinian ships. In the case of merchant ships this would in the first instance be to warn off. You may attack any submarines which demonstrate hostile intent. Instructions on mutual defence and Maritime International Law as at 2(a)(i) above.

ii) SSNs

Any conventional submarine detected may be presumed to be Argentinian and may be attacked. All Argentinian warships and naval auxiliaries positively identified may be attacked.

c) Execution of Operation (Annex C)

Aim is to repossess South Georgia.

i) Surface Vessels

Any action necessary to achieve aim may be taken against ships and aircraft positively identified as Argentinian. You may attack any submarine which demonstrates hostile intent.

ii) SSNs

As at 2(b)(ii) above.
