1. MILITARY ISSUES

THE CHIEF OF THE DEFENCE STAFF briefed the Sub-Committee on the latest military situation.

THE DEFENCE SECRETARY said that he would be making a further statement to the press at about 1 pm. The Chief of the Defence Staff would be present.

The Sub-Committee -

2. POLITICAL ISSUES

The Sub-Committee had before them telegrams no. 811-5 from the United Kingdom Mission to the United Nations in New York, reporting proceedings in the Security Council; and other telegrams reporting international reactions to the current situation.

THE FOREIGN AND COMMONWEALTH SECRETARY said that proceedings in the Security Council had gone reasonably well so far. Steps were being taken to ensure that a correct text of the final Argentine proposals to the United Nations Secretary General was published; and to stimulate well-disposed states to join in the Security Council debate.
