Action Taken

- 1. SIR TERENCE LEWIN invited the Deputy Chief of the Defence Staff (Intelligence) to update them on current intelligence.
- LIEUTENANT GENERAL GLOVER (Deputy Chief of the Defence Staff (Intelligence)) reviewed the intelligence published in the latest summary (1). He assessed Argentine naval dispositions and possible courses of action, and Argentine deployments on East Falkland.
- In discussion the following points were agreed:
 - a. The bombing attack (2) by an Argentine C130 aircraft on the MV BRITISH WYE 400 miles North West of South Georgia, well outside the Total Exclusion Zone, was a serious extension of the conflict. The Foreign and Commonwealth Office should be invited to make a strong diplomatic protest.
 - The Permanent Under Secretary and the Foreign and Commonwealth Office should be invited to consider further what action could be taken about Argentine merchant ships loitering near Ascension Island. There was no security objection to these ships being named when visual identification had been obtained.
 - The Argentine notification that the hospital ship BAHIA PARAISO was to enter the Bay of Harbours on East Falkland had been given too late, and had not been received until after the ship

had been intercepted by HMS PLYMOUTH. The Foreign and Commonwealth Office should be invited to take up with Brazil, as the Protecting Power, the need for timely notice of such movements.

d. The possibility of the Argentines trying to retain and perhaps reinforce West Falkland as a diplomatic counter in any future negotiations should not be overlooked.

ITEM 2. OWN FORCES

- 4. REAR-ADMIRAL BROWN (Assistant Chief of the Defence Staff (Operations)) outlined the deployment and operations of the Task Force.
- 5. Summing up a short discussion, SIR TERENCE LEWIN said that, in the light of the intelligence assessment of Argentine naval intentions and of the attack on the MV BRITISH WYE, he would raise again (3) at OD(SA) that day the question of attacks on Argentine naval ships within the 12 mile coastal limit.

ITEM 3. PUBLIC RELATIONS

- 6. MR McDONALD (Deputy Chief of Fublic Relations) reported on press coverage.
- 7. In discussion, concern was expressed at the continued premature disclosure of operational plans and unit identities both in London and by reporters with the Task Force, which was causing strong reactions among the Force. Despite measures to improve security of information and control over reports, leaks were still occurring, not always from military sources. Furthermore, many reports were based largely on speculation. The Permanent Under Secretary, however, had spoken to the Acting Director General of the BBC about this the previous evening, and intended that day to remind the press generally about security.
- 8. Summing up, SIR TERENCE LEWIN said they would wish the News Release Group that day to announce details of Argentine casualties at Goose Green and Darwin Settlement, and to publicise the movements of the Argentine

hospital ship BAHIA PARAISO and its planned rendezvous with the SS UGANDA. He also said he would raise in OD(SA) that morning whether any publicity should be given to the capture at Goose Green of what appeared to be Napalm weapons.
