OPERATION CORPORATEITEM 1. INTELLIGENCE

1. SIR MICHAEL BEETHAM (Acting Chief of the Defence Staff) invited the Deputy Chief of the Defence Staff (Intelligence) to update them on current intelligence.

2. LIEUTENANT GENERAL GLOVER (Deputy Chief of the Defence Staff (Intelligence)) reviewed the intelligence published in the latest summary (1). He said they were not certain of the strength of Argentine units in the Falkland Islands but he assessed their total strength in the Islands to be about 10,000 men.

ITEM 2. OWN FORCES

3. The situation was set out in the Force Tote Sitrep (2).
4. The Committee were informed that Port Stanley had been attacked by a Vulcan aircraft that morning; results of the attack were not yet known.

ITEM 3. PUBLIC RELATIONS

5. MR McDONALD (Deputy Chief of Public Relations) reported on Press coverage.

6. The Committee discussed the facilities to be offered to the Press that day. It was agreed that:

- a. The Concourse Hall should be open to reporters from mid-day.

b. There should be no statement giving operational details that day, and any queries should be answered in as low a key as possible.

c. The involvement of Vulcan aircraft should not be admitted, although it could be said that such aircraft, based in UK, had an air-to-air refuelling capability and were available for operations world-wide.

d. If it could be established that our forces had suffered no casualties, this could be stated in answering questions.

7. Summing up, SIR MICHAEL BEETHAM said they would wish to instruct their Secretary to arrange for the Secretary of State and the Chief of the Defence Staff to be informed of their decisions.

ITEM 4. ACTIONS AND DECISIONS REQUIRED

8. The Committee noted the summary of actions in hand (3). They were informed that the two officers tasked to report on the defence of Ascension Island had been delayed at Gibraltar, and that therefore the report at Item 0075 might not be ready for them the next day; and that the paper on Military Options (Item 0023) would now be tabled at their meeting the next day.

9. The Committee were also informed that the Canberra PR Option (Item 0079) now had little military advantage, as the Sea Harriers had a photo-reconnaissance capability. The Air Force Department were considering proposals to return the Canberras and their supporting elements to the UK.

ITEM 5. SPECIAL FORCES

10. The Committee agreed to instruct the Special Operations Group to refer to them any questions affecting the availability and priority of tasking of additional Special Forces for Operation CORPORATE.
