LETTER DATED 24 MAY 1982 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF
SURINAME TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF
THE SECURITY COUNCIL

Upon the express instructions of my Government, I have the honour to transmit herewith its official position concerning the situation in the region of the Islas Malvinas:

"The Government of the Republic of Suriname, on learning of a further escalation of the crisis around the Islas Malvinas, is increasingly concerned by the latest military and economic actions of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland against Argentina which seriously hamper a peaceful solution of the crisis within the framework of the United Nations.

"Argentina has struggled relentlessly for 149 years, through peaceful means, to recover its sovereignty over the Islas Malvinas, which were seized by British military force from the then young Republic of Argentina.

"The Government of the Republic of Suriname expresses its solidarity with the People of Argentina in its struggle to restore sovereignty over its full territory.

"The Government of the Republic of Suriname, therefore, calls urgently upon the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland to withdraw its armed forces from the region of the Islas Malvinas and to resume peaceful negotiations to resolve the conflict.

"In this regard, the Government of the Republic of Suriname deplores that the British military and economic actions against Argentina are being supported by many of its NATO allies.

"This support, which disregards the general and specific interest of the developing countries, cannot be considered as encouraging a peaceful settlement."
